Belmont Abbey College Internship Addendum: COVID-19 Preparedness Plan

Belmont Abbey College takes the health and safety of our students very seriously. In response to the increasing spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus), we are taking the following steps to mitigate the potential of transmission of COVID-19 between the student intern and the internship site.

A. Student Intern Responsibilities:

- **1.** Familiarize yourself with your internship site's Exposure Prevention, Preparedness, Response Policies and Procedures for COVID-19.
- **2.** Discuss with your Internship Supervisor prior to the beginning of the internship any specific requirements for your particular function and safety protocols.
- **3.** Be aware of the CDC (Center for Disease Control) preventative guidelines listed below.
- **4.** If you feel that you are unable to meet the safety requirements of your internships site, notify the Office of Career Services and Internships immediately.
- 5. If you have been diagnosed with COVID-19 or exposed to someone diagnosed with COVID-19, immediately quarantine yourself and report this information to both your site supervisor and the Office of Career Services and Internships.

B. Internship Site Responsibilities:

- 1. Educate student intern of your organization's Exposure Prevention, Preparedness, Response Policies and Procedures for COVID-19.
- 2. Treat student intern in the same manner as other employees in terms of providing any personal protective equipment (PPE).
- **3.** Communicate any changes to the policies in a timely manner to student intern.
- 4. Be aware of the CDC (Center for Disease Control) preventative guidelines listed below.
- 5. The site must provide at least a ten day written notice to terminate the internship.

Prevention: The following preventative information is directly from <u>www.cdc.gov</u>.

Until you are able to get a vaccination, the best way to prevent illness is to avoid exposure to this virus. However, as a reminder, CDC always recommends everyday preventative actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases, Including:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick. Keep 6 feet between yourself and others.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Stay at home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after using the restroom, before eating, after blowing your nose, after coughing, or after sneezing.
 - \circ $\;$ If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

- Follow the CDC's recommendation for using a cloth face cover
 - CDC recommends covering your mouth with a cloth face cover when around others.
 - Cloth face covers should not be placed on children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.
 - The cloth cover is meant to protect other people if you are infected.
 - \circ $\;$ Do not use a facemask meant for a healthcare worker.
 - \circ $\;$ The cloth face cover is not a substitute for social distancing.
