Submit Your Application

- An essay is not required for initial submission.
- You will be prompted to create a CFNC (College Foundation of North Carolina) account. This is a free account and it allows you to work on your application over time.

Apply For Housing and Meal Plan

- Please complete the housing application in order to receive a room assignment in June. This must be completed no later than **May 31, of senior year** if you'd like to use the room mate selection feature. If you do not complete this by May 31, 2020, then we will auto-assign your roommate for you. The Housing Application will be emailed to you after your deposit is received.

- Resident students must purchase one of these two meal plans. These plans must be purchased through the Business Office, not through the campus dining service.

Fill Out the Registration Questionnaire

- Incoming students must complete a registration questionnaire for class placement. After you submit your deposit you will receive this questionnaire via email.

Submit Medical Forms
