### Program Summary

The Department of English offers a major and a minor in English literature. Through the study of literature, students develop a general, comprehensive understanding of civilization and their place in it. Students seeking a bachelor's degree in English study the most significant literary works in the traditional periods of British and American literature, along with selected classical literary texts, and develop a working understanding of the theoretical principles which allow them to interpret these works. In addition to acquiring this knowledge and an appreciation of literary expression, English majors develop critical skills and the ability to organize information, form conclusions, and express them persuasively.
