(December 23, 2024) – Belmont Abbey College's Executive Director of the Belmont House in Washington, D.C., Emmett McGroarty, has co-authored a new booklet titled *Restoring the Republic: A Blueprint for Constitutional Administration.* The publication, created in collaboration with Charles Keckler, JD, PhD, and Adam Millsap, PhD, is released through the Pioneer Institute.

The booklet addresses the pressing need for a renewed understanding of constitutional governance in the United States. It aims to provide a comprehensive framework outlining detailed, actionable reforms aimed at realigning federal government agencies with the Constitution.

Emmett McGroarty is a graduate of Georgetown University and the Fordham University School of Law. He joined the Belmont House in April 2023 from the Catholic University of America's Institute for Human Ecology, where he served as a faculty fellow and director of the program on the Constitution and Catholic Social Doctrine. McGroarty expressed his enthusiasm for this project, stating, 'We must improve administrative processes by grounding them in the principles of American constitutional government. This booklet offers a blueprint to restore that connection, ensuring accountability, transparency, and respect for individual rights." His involvement highlights Belmont Abbey College's commitment to engaging with critical issues that shape society today.

The collaboration with Keckler and Millsap brings together expertise in law, public policy, and economics. Together, the authors explore actionable reforms aimed at realigning federal government agencies with the Constitution.
